### Welcome, Dixie Payne

Meeting called to order at 7:06 p.m.

Number present: 17. Board members present: all.

Dixie welcomed everyone and thanked them for coming.

### Treasurer's Report, Monica Allen

Monica talks about the success of the Hawk Hustle. It brought it more than \$18,000, about \$3,000 was spent putting it on with a net of more than \$15,000.

Monica then went through the teacher grants the PTO board recently approved with Mr. Neville and Mr. Roberson. Several teachers will be getting money from the PTO. The PTO budgets about \$5,000/year (\$2,500 for fall semester, \$2,500 for spring). With a \$2,500 budget, there was \$7,000 in requests. Gave out more than \$3,000 in grants.

### President's Report, Dixie Payne

Dixie thanked several people for all their volunteer work including Shelly (spirit wear), Stephanie and Stacie (yearbook—order yours soon!), Catherine (spirit nights), and Liz (for feeding the teachers).

Volunteers are needed for art show on Nov. 16th. A sign-up genius will be going out soon for that.

### Vice President's Report, Carisa Godwin

Carisa talked about OneOrbit. An astronaut recently came to the school to talk with the students about living in space for a year. The guest speaker was paid for by the PTO.

### Vice Principal's Report

Mr. Roberson talked about the concerns some parents have expressed about Foothills and Soaring Eagle. There are some options on the table about putting up a crosswalk there. In order to paint a crosswalk, the path has to be paved. The admin is aware of it and working on some type of solution. Mr. Roberson also talked about Avid4 Adventure. The students had a great time and what a great program it is.

### SAC Report, Laura Schnelle

SAC meeting was at 6pm, right before the PTO meeting. Laura recapped the meeting. They discussed the students' test scores from this year compared to last. There was also some discussion/brain storming ideas about what to do with students' lunch time because some kids have been complaining about how short lunch is.
